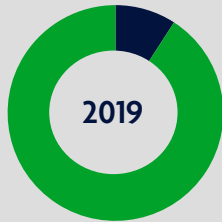

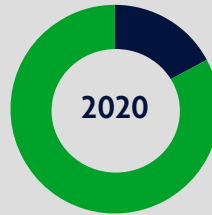

Domestic vs International Spending:

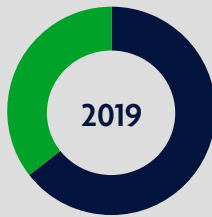


● Domestic Spending:

USD 1,841.1MN (91%)

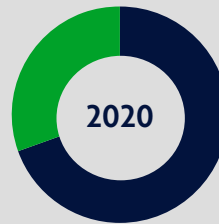


● Domestic Spending:
