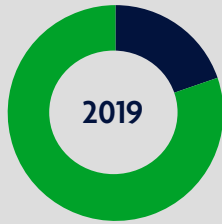

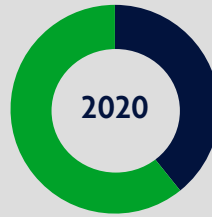

USD 1,762.0MN (20%)

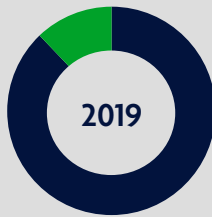
● International Spending:

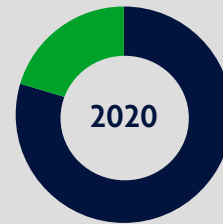
